

RULES & CONDITIONS

- 1 Entries must be on an Entry Form available from the Entries Secretary and accompanied by the correct Entry Fee.
- 2 All animals to be on the Show Ground by 9.00 a.m.
- 3 No exhibits shall be removed until after the Grand Parade without permission (in writing) from the Show Secretary.
- 4 All protests to be made in writing to the Secretary before 6.00 p.m. on the day of the Show with a fee of £20.00 which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. The decision of the Committee is final.
- 5 Entries in District Classes are confined to residents in the parishes of:- Hartland, Parkham, Clovelly, Alwington, Bulkworthy, Buckland Brewer, East & West Putford, Woolsery, Bradworthy, Welcombe, Abbotsham, Littleham, Sutcombe, Newton St Petrock & Abbots Bickington.
- 6 All Exhibitors in the classes for horses, cattle, and sheep must have been the property of the Exhibitor for at least two months prior to the Show date.
- 7 In the event of a objection to a horses height the objector shall deposit £20.00 with the Committee to be entitled to have the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon to the Society ascertain the horses height. (20.00 refunded if objection sustained)
- 8 Neither the Secretary nor the Committee will be held responsible for errors, mistakes or accidents, which may occur.
- 9 Cup winners are responsible for having Trophies engraved. If this is not done the Committee cannot undertake to keep Cups up to date.
- 10 Cup winners must parade their winning exhibits in the Grand Parade.
- 11 Prize money for all classes will be given in the rings on the day.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF EXHIBITORS, RIDERS AND STOCK ATTENDANTS

All exhibitors are reminded that they must comply with all current DEFRA regulations.

Exhibitors or their Riders/Stock attendants must be competent and take total responsibility of their stock at all times whilst on the Showground. All persons in charge of exhibits will be required to parade or exhibit the animals in their charge at times as directed by the Stewards of the Society. Stock attendants must be in attendance at least a quarter of an hour before the time appointed for exhibiting the animals under their charge in the Show Rings. No Stock attendants shall be allowed to lead more than one animal at a time in the Judging Ring or Main Ring. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their Riders/Stock Attendants and for the consequences of any misconduct. The Stewards have the power to remove from the Showground the Stock or property belonging to, and to cancel the admission ticket of any exhibitor who infringes any of the Regulations or Conditions of the Show, or who refuses to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards, without any responsibility attaching to them in consequences of such removal.

CATTLE PRESENTATION

In the interests of other exhibitors and the general public, aisles must be kept clear at all times. The Cattle lines will be closed to the general public whilst animals are being moved for judging. *Exhibitors of Bulls* must comply with the Guidance Note GS36 issued by the Health and Safety Executive concerning the safe handling of bulls at Agricultural Shows. Handlers must be in good health and properly trained in safe work methods (HSE Agricultural Information Sheet 35)

SECURING OF CATTLE

All cattle must be properly secured to the satisfaction of the Officers of the Society on being brought to the gate of the Showground, or they will not be admitted. All Bulls must have a ring or clamp attached to the nose and, in the aged class, must be provided with a strong chain. *Bulls* must be double tied in the lines. Exhibitors of bulls must also comply with Guidance Note GS36 issued by the Health and Safety Executive concerning the safe custody and handling of bulls at Agricultural Shows. All other cattle must be halter- led whilst in the Showground. Stock attendants are responsible for their own Cattle at all times

COMPETENCE OF EXHIBITORS

All exhibitors must have the relevant experience to be competent to handle the animal in their charge at all times.

ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

Livestock exhibitors are reminded that the show environment can be upsetting for livestock, even those of normally placid temperament. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament should not be brought to the Showground. When in the opinion of the Officers, the Stewards, the Police or the Health & Safety Executive, an animal's behaviour poses an immediate threat to the people in its vicinity the Society reserves the right to take appropriate action to mitigate the threat.

GRAND PARADE

Exhibitors must ensure that sufficient stock attendants are available to lead all first, second and third prize-winning animals for the Grand Parade. Failure to parade may result in forfeiture of prize-money.

TRANSIT OF ANIMALS

From January 2007 Welfare in Transport Regulation (EC) no. 1.2005 will apply. NOTE: It will be an offence to transport any female animal for whom 90% or more of the gestation period has already passed or female animals that have given birth in the previous week.

PLEASE NOTE: If you are transporting animals over 65 Kms you will require an Animal Transporter Authorisation and as from January 2008 it is now a legal requirement to have a Certificate of Competence for transporting animals over 65Kms (Please check with your local authority)

BIOSECURITY

The Show is licensed by DEFRA in accordance with the requirements of the Animal Gatherings England Order 2006. All animals attendants are asked to co-operate by observing the Bio-Security rules. The animal areas should be kept clean and free from faecal contamination. Attendants should wear protective clothing and footwear capable of being disinfected whilst in the animal area. When leaving the animal area, attendants should remove protective clothing, wash their hands and ensure that footwear is clean and disinfected. When Showing or attending Parades, clean white coats or “Breed Uniforms” should be worn and suitable disinfectable footwear. (No Trainers)

LICENSING AND DOCUMENTATION.

To comply with the conditions of the DEFRA licence all animals will be examined by a veterinary Surgeon upon entry to the Showground.

ANIMALS ENTERING THE SHOWGROUND MUST PRESENT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS AT THE VETERINARY INSPECTION POINT

CATTLE – BCMS Passport. Applies to all cattle, including calves, for show or exhibition. The Show will record all movements onto and off the Showground..

SHEEP – AML 1 Licence. Applies to all Sheep including Commercial Lambs, Primitive Portland and Hill Sheep. After completion at the entry gate, The Show Society will retain the two copies on entry (the top copy will be forwarded to the Trading Standards Authority) The yellow copy will be returned to the owner.

MAEDI-VISNA. A completed SAC Sheep Health Scheme Certificate, with a valid expiry date, will be collected at the Veterinary inspection point.

ANIMALS LEAVING THE SHOWGROUND MUST PRESENT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS AT THE DEPARTURE GATE.

CATTLE – None

SHEEP – AML 1 Licence. Applies to all Sheep. Exhibitors should ensure relevant section is completed by a representative of the Show Society, at the Stock Office, prior to departure. The top copy will be collected by a Trading Standards Officer on departure.

EQUINE EXHIBITORS

HEALTH AND SAFETY

To comply with Health and Safety Executive guidelines the Society has provided horse walks. It is a condition of entry that all exhibits keep within these designated routes; that all reasonable precautions are taken to prevent accidents and that guidance is taken from Officials or Stewards at crossing points etc.

HATS

It is mandatory for all riders to wear a protective helmet manufactured to British Standard EN 1384, ASTM F 1163 or PAS 015 with Kite Mark or SEI or such other suitable protective headgear as offers a similar or higher level of protection and is at least that of British Standard EN 1384, ASTM F 1163 or PAS 015. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the Showground. Hats or helmets requiring covers must be worn with a plain, dark coloured silk.

STALLIONS

All Stallions, 3 years old and over must, at all times, be wearing a bit or chifney whilst moving around the Showground. In the interest of safety.

If you are transporting animals over 65kms you may require an Animal Transporter Authorisation and as from January 2008 it is a legal requirement to have a Certificate of Competence for transporting animals over 65kms (please check with your local authority).

HORSE PASSPORTS

All horses and ponies should be accompanied by their Defra passport.

- Class 1 Open Competition. Best Hunter Colt, Gelding or Filly foaled in 2008
- Class 2 Open Competition. Best Hunter Gelding or Filly foaled in 2007
- Class 3 Open Competition. Best Hunter Gelding or Filly foaled in 2006
- Class 4 Open Competition. Best Gelding or Filly in 2006, 07, 08, likely to make Small Hunter or Riding Horse, not exceeding 15.2hh at maturity.
- Class 5 Open Competition. Brood Mare calculated to breed a Hunter, with her own Foal at Foot or in foal
(a certificate of service will be required in this case).
- Class 6 Best Hunter type Foal.
- Class 7 Best Foal sired by one of Mr. G. Heal's Stallions.

A Premium will be awarded by Mrs G Heal to the Brood Mare winning class 5.

Special prize of £5.00 will be awarded to the Best District Exhibitor in classes 1- 7 provided they have not won any of these classes.

A Special Prize of £5 will be awarded to the best exhibit not exceeding 15.2hh in class 5.

The Kipling Tors Cup will be awarded to the best exhibit in classes 1 – 7

NPS MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN HAND KILMANNAN STUD SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIP

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony in the Mountain & Moorland In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the Qualification Card. (See NPS Silver Medal Championship Conditions in this schedule).

NPS SILVER MEDAL CHAMPIONSHIP CONDITIONS.

These Championships are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded where the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced in the ring. If the Owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card cannot be produced in the ring, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided the Owner is a Member of the NPS and the membership card is produced in the ring. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The

Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can only be awarded to the Champion or Reserve Champion. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2009, providing they send to the NPS Secretariat the relevant entry fee and qualification card

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships

To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2010.

Whilst classes 8 to 19 are qualifiers, competitors with horses/ponies, which do not meet the qualification criteria, may still enter.

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND

All exhibitors must enter the relevant Breed Society registration number on the entry form.

- Class 8** Mountain & Moorland in-hand registered in the Stud Book of the Welsh A & B, Dartmoor, Exmoor & Shetland, 3 years and under
- Class 9** Mountain & Moorland in-hand registered in the Stud Book of the Welsh A & B, Dartmoor, Exmoor & Shetland, 4 years and over
- Class 10** Mountain & Moorland in-hand registered in the Stud Book of Welsh C & D, Connemara, New Forest, Dales, Fells and Highlands, 3 years and under
- Class 11** Mountain & Moorland in-hand registered in the Stud Book of Welsh C & D, Connemara, New Forest, Dales, Fells and Highlands, 4 years and over.
- Class 12** Ridden Mountain & Moorland Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over Registered in the Stud Book of the Welsh C & D, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Fells and Highlands. Rider any age.
- Class 13** Ridden Mountain & Moorland Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over Registered in the Stud Book of the Welsh A & B, Dartmoor, Exmoor and Shetland. Rider any age.
- Class 14** The Lobster Pot Mountain & Moorland Leading Rein Class. Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 122cms. Registered in The Breed Society Stud Books of the Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest and Welsh A or B. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

A Shield kindly presented by Mrs. Alexander-Ford will be awarded to the Best Mountain and Moorland exhibit in classes 8 – 14

If insufficient entries come forward on the day classes 8/9 & 10/11 will be merged.

SOUTH WEST PONY ASSOCIATION

This Show includes qualifiers for the South West Pony Association Championships 2009. Owners and Exhibitors of equines which qualify for The South West Pony Championships MUST return the qualification card along with any membership fee due within FOURTEEN days of this qualification show. Failure to comply with the rule will render the qualification invalid. Qualifying classes are 1 – 7, 8 – 11, 12 – 14, 22 – 27, 50 - 54.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY QUALIFIERS

This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society ("B.S.P.S."), and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.

This show is a qualifier for the 2009 B.S.P.S. Championships Show (26-29th August 2009) to be held at Arena UK. The 1st and 2nd prize winners only in Classes 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19 are qualifiers for the Championships Show, provided the animal is registered in accordance with rules 23 & 28 and ridden by a B.S.P.S. member.

RIDDEN PONIES

- Class 15 Rider** The B.S.P.S. Leading Rein Pony Mare or Gelding 4 years and over not exceeding 117cms. Not to have attained their 7th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 16 Rider not** The B.S.P.S. First Ridden Pony Mare or Gelding 4 years and over not exceeding 122cms. to have attained their 10th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 17 to** The B.S.P.S. Show Pony Mare or Gelding 4 years and over not exceeding 128cms. Rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 18 exceeding** The B.S.P.S. Show Pony Mare or Gelding 4 years and over exceeding 128cms. but not 138cm. Rider not to have attained their 15th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 19 exceeding** The B.S.P.S. Show Pony Mare or Gelding 4 years and over, exceeding 138cms. but not 148cm. Rider not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

The Taw Garage Perpetual Challenge Cup will be presented to the winner of class 18.

The Littlemoor Perpetual Cup will be presented to the winner of Class 15

The Miss Muffett Perpetual Cup will be presented to the Best District Exhibit in class 15

The Simpson Challenge Cup will be presented to the overall Best Child's Pony classes 16 – 19

The Stevenstone Challenge Cup presented by the late Major W Ascott OBE TD JP To be held for one year. For the Best Horse Hunted and Resident in the Stevenstone country. This includes country loaned to the Torrington Farmers, Tetcott and South Tetcott Hunts by the MFH Stevenstone Hunt. Classes 22 – 24. The J.P. Kemble Trophy will be presented for the Best Ridden Hunter in classes 22– 24.

WORKING HUNTERS

Class 25 Novice Working Hunter. Mare or Gelding 4 years and over. Horse or Pony not to have been placed in any Working Hunter Class prior to the show.

Class 26 Working Hunter Mare or Gelding 4 years and over, not exceeding 15hh.

Jumps approximately 2'6"

Special Prizes of £5.00 will be awarded to the Best Pony 13hh and under and 14hh and under in classes 25 and 26

A Special Prize of £5.00 and a Rosette will be awarded in each class for the Best District Exhibitor. Leading two District Exhibitors in each class may enter the Championship

In the event that the Champion has already qualified then the Reserve Champion to qualify. If the Reserve has also qualified, the Rosette to be awarded to the Champion. Once qualified, the horse, whip and vehicle may not be changed.
